

Guard – Protective equipment that in a fixed position, bolted on, that protects operator from accessing moving parts.

 OSHA 29 CFR 1910.217 defines a guard as an enclosure that prevents anyone from reaching over, under, around, or through the guard even if they really tried.



Shield – Protective equipment that is movable/flexible that is designed to knock down debris, prevent inadvertent contact with rotating parts. I.E. PTO shields, chains, etc.
